Abstract

This paper argues that it is difficult for a firm to extend a well-respected brand name from a given quality segment to a higher quality segment. We argue that to enter a higher quality segment, a firm must either introduce a new brand name, or use the existing brand name in the upscale market and cease using it in the lower level market. We present suggestive empirical evidence from Japanese entry into the U.S. luxury car market.

Develop a Hybrid Personnel Scheduling Model

Abstract

Personnel scheduling is one of the important tasks for human resource management. Due to its complexity, its challenging features, and its practical relevance, personnel scheduling has been heavily researched in the last few decades. Normally, there are three scheduling problems, (1) shift scheduling problem, (2) days-off scheduling problem, and (3) tour scheduling problem. The approaches used to resolve those problems are (1) permanence centered planning, (2) fluctuation centered planning, (3) mobility centered planning, and (4) project centered planning. In this study, we reviewed and summarized the present personnel scheduling types and approaches, and then proposed a hybrid personnel-scheduling model to tackle such a complex personnel-scheduling problem. It is a mixed integerprogramming model, which considers flexible working hours, deformation working hours, scheduling of mobility, and flexibility of scheduling changes. A simplified real-world case study and data of a Taiwan aviation company are utilized to demonstrate the merits of the proposed model comparing to its original approach.

New Vision for Environmental Education for Children through the Arts: Pesticides as A Case Study Topic

Young Imm Kang Song* Lesley University, USA

Abstract

This study considers how educators can use the topic of pesticides to spark contemplative thinking and discussion about many different facets of environmental education while simultaneously training students how to stay safe when coming into contact with pesticides. Research questions include: How can we make pesticide education a launching pad for thinking and discussing many aspects of environmental education? educators avoid eco-phobia among children and teach practical ways to stay safe? How can teachers find out what local pesticide threats affect their students? What practical examples can we provide of classroom application? The goal of this educational approach is to allow children to learn and appreciate ecological issues at the local and community level, while also gaining an awareness of the larger global issues and the connections between the micro- and macro-spheres. What these approaches all share is a focus on engaging and exciting the learner, and on encouraging thought, reflection, emotional connection and ultimately action in support of shared ecological goals. It examines this being applied at two levels: in the pre K-8 classroom or community education setting, and in a graduate-level university classroom of in-service teachers and teachers-to-be.

Students' Feedback on their Supervised Work Experience Programme at the Universiti Teknologi Brunei

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Abstract

Feedback is very important for any organization for the sake of improvement. In educational institutions, students' feedback helps to comprehend their perception on the quality of education delivered. The paper presents feedback of students attached to various companies during their Supervised Work Experience (SWE) programme. The aim of the study is to assess quality of the SWE programme offered by the Universiti Teknologi Brunei (UTB), Brunei Darussalam. A survey questionnaire is used to know the students' feedback on their SWE programme. The assessment takes into account various aspects of SWE programme. Students are found satisfied with majority of the components of their SWE programme. However, weak areas are identified and suggestions are provided for improvement in some components of the programme. Findings of the study provide insights that could assist in improving quality of the future SWE programme resulting in development of curriculum offered by Mechanical Engineering programme at UTB.

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Measuring Information Ethics' Cognition and Behavior: An Empirical Validation

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Abstract

This study has aimed to construct and validate an empirical multidimensional measure of information ethics' cognition and behavior. Using different scenarios, and a different sample in a different context, the present study has empirically tested the PAPA conceptual model of the central issues of information ethics as well as the main socio-psychological perspectives such as the theories of Social Cognition, Reasoned Action and Planned Behavior. The findings of this study have provided a piece of evidence in favor of the applicability of the theories of Social Cognition and Planned Behavior to the realm of information ethics. Furthermore, the cognition of information ethics' issues has positively and significantly predicted the intentions and actual behavior related to the ethical use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs).

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Lymphocyte Expression of Intracellular Cytokines and Hemeoxygenase-1 in Peripheral Blood of Patients With Atopic Dermatitis

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Abstract

The cells expressing IL-4 and IL-10 (Th2 cytokines) in nonlesional skin of atopic dermatitis (AD) patients during the acute phase, and an increase in the cells expressing TNF- α and IFN- Υ (Th1 cytokines) in the chronic phase. Hemeoxygenase-1 (HO-1) is a heat shock protein that greatly reduces oxidative tissue damage occurring as a major feature of many inflammatory pathologies. The study evaluates CD4+ T cell expression of intracellular cytokines: Th1 (TNF-α and IFN-Υ) and Th2 (IL-4 and IL-10); and HO-1 in patients with AD to provide a preliminary description of correlations between inflammatory cytokines and HO-1, the regulator of oxidative stress. It also suggests a possible therapeutic role for HO-1. The study included 21 patients diagnosed with AD and 12 healthy subjects used as control, age and gender were matched between the AD patients and the healthy subjects. PBMC extracted from the blood of each patient was cultured with PMA/ ionomycin to induce expression of proinflammatory biomarkers in CD4+ T cells differentiated to express Th1 or Th2 cytokines and HO-1. Evaluations were performed using FC 500 Beckman Coulter flow cytometer. Higher levels of CD4+ T cell cytokines expression (TNF-α and IFN-Υ, IL-4 and IL-10) as well as HO-1 were observed in AD patients versus healthy control subjects. A significant direct correlation was observed between CD4+ T cells expressing IFN-Y+ and IL-5 (r = 0.651) and between CD4+ T cells expressing TNF- α and HO-1 (r = 0.643). These results show an elevation of T cell cytokine expression of both Th1 and Th2 subtypes and a direct correlation between these two cell populations suggesting a systemic inflammatory profile. Upregulation of the HO-1 is an attempt by the body to limit skin inflammation and it suggests a possible therapeutic role.

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Imatinib-Induced Downregulation of Skp2 Inhibits Cell Growth in Human Squamous Cell Carcinoma

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Abstract

S-phase kinase associated protein (Skp2) is known to play a crucial role in tumorigenesis of various human cancers. Imatinib, an inhibitor of BCR-ABL tyrosine kinase, c-kit, and platelet derived growth factor (PDGF) receptor, has been approved for the treatment and investigation of chronic myeloid leukemia, gastrointestinal stromal tumors, and various additional solid tumors. However, its efficacy for treatment of skin cancer has not been yet investigated. The aim of this study was to explore the effect of imatinib on Skp2 and to determine whether it has an antitumor effect in human skin cancer. To explore the effect of imatinib on cell growth of A431 cells (squamous cell carcinoma/skin cancer), we conducted a CCK8 assay and flow cytometry. A western blot assay was performed to determine the function of imatinib in A431 cells as well as the underlying molecular mechanism. Imatinib significantly inhibited cell growth and induced cell cycle arrest at the G0/G1 phase. Furthermore, depletion of Skp2 triggered cell cycle arrest and inhibited colony formation. Mechanistically, imatinib markedly downregulated Skp2 protein expression and subsequently upregulated p21 expression via increased protein stability. In conclusion, imatinib demonstrates its antitumor activity via Skp2-p21 signaling axis, and these findings suggest that target of Skp2 by imatinib could be a novel therapeutic approach for clinical trials of squamous cell carcinoma.
