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KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Azhari, S.STP., M.Si



Azhari was born on June 10, 1976 in Mawasangka, Indonesia. He is the Rector of Universitas Sembilanbelas November who received an award from MURI with number 6562/r.MURI/VII/2014 as the youngest Chancellor records in Indonesia in 2014. Though relatively young, but with great professional experience in the field of public administration and community service Azhari successfully led the USN Kolaka in three turns of institutional forms. One of his professional experiences as alumni STPDN Azhari was his position as Regent of Kolaka expert staff from 2003-2008.

As academician, Azhari has published more than 20 books and a number of both national and international publications. As a doctor in the field of public administration, Azhari experts in reviewing the system of bureaucracy. His publications focused on benchmarking bureaucratic system of Indonesia with a number of countries. At the end of 2009, he completed his dissertation at UGM through a bureaucratic benchmark toward Indonesia and Malaysia; then following are his bechmarking studies of bureaucratic Indonesia and Japan in 2016; as well as he is trying to publish a benchmark study of bureaucratic system Indonesia, Malaysia and Singapore at this conference.

One thing is for sure that Azhari through his dissertation had been dared to formulate that the bureaucratic system in Indonesia is a new bureaucratic system which is not found in any previous theory. If previously, Carino and his predecessors Marley Fainsoed, Dun Leavy & Olea'vy only emphasized that in theory bureaucratic systems in the world are basically the only two models namely Executive Ascendancy and Bureaucratic Sublation. Then later, Azhari upgraded it by adding a new model of Executive Ascendancy or the Executive or Extreme Personal Ascendancy which occurred in Indonesia.

Modeling System of Decision Making Feasibility of Aircraft Departure

Abstract

Celerity and appropriate decisions will be the key of success for a decision maker. Information is not enough to help in making decision, if not able to process and get involved into the best alternatives for making decision. The aim of this research is to build models and application of decision support systems for ground handling services provider in Haluoleo Airport Kendari. The process of ground handling activities can be fast and accurate in taking a decision in order to determine the readiness of the aircraft departs from the specified schedule. The reference to the enforcement of passengers, goods and cargo aircraft transported to Dirjenhubud was issued by the Department of Transportation on ground handling services namely technical handling, and ramp passenger & baggage handling. These problems can be solved with the construction of a model of making a decision support system. The model used is the Model Optimization Analytics and Optimization Alternatives Limited models using a model of Multi Attribute Decision Making (MADM) through the method of Simple Additive Weighting (SAW). The implementation of model system is useful for the manager of the airport ground handling in the process, so that the ground handling activities of managers operational can determine what steps should be taken, in that it can minimize their biggest mistakes for flight.

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The Collaborative Management Model on Developing the Infrastructure of the Airport in Kolaka, Sulawesi Tenggara

Abstract

Collaborative management of the public sector is being introduced as a new approach to solve the problems which are mainly on the restrictiveness of bureaucracy in answering such public demand. Therefore, collaborative approach presents new actors out of the government in processing the public sectors. The relationship among actors in its collaboration is well-developed through consensus, to gain valuable decision to all. Based on the problems mentioned, this study focuses on the model of collaborative management on developing the infrastructure of airport. To answer the objective of the study, therefore, this research applied qualitative approach in which the respondents are those who were being involved in constructing process of the airport. The data gained from interview will be analyzed through interactive model consisting of some procedures; data reduction, data presentation, verification of the data/ drawing conclusion. The result showed that collaborative management model in infrastructure development of the airport was a management model, in this case collective action based on the principle of synergy participation. In this context, there was no single actor on the development of infrastructure of the airport. Through collective action, the related aspects in this case, the development of infrastructure, was transparently communicated to avoid miscommunication among the members. Therefore, the actors which were being involved in the collaboration bore the needs reasonably and also there was no such member who was being burdened. Thus, the implication of collaboration based on the consensus, the collaboration on the development of infrastructure of the airport is on the basis of participation which pointed out the appointment and the continuation of the development.

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A Comparison of Bureaucratic Practitioner Recruitment Toward Singapore, Malaysia And Indonesia

Abstract

This study aims to describe the differences in the recruitment of bureaucratic practitioners in Singapore, Malaysia and Indonesia. This is done based on the striking difference between the development of Singapore, Malaysia and Indonesia. The gap is believed closely related with the bureaucracy system imposed pattern including the recruitment of civil servants in its country. By using the descriptive method, the study concluded three Conclusions. First, the appointment of civil servants in Singapore based on the need to ensure that the system runs fairly decentralization, meritocracy and impartiality. At second, Malaysia conducts recruitment through the Management Integrity Committees aimed at creating a system of administration and government officials were efficient and disciplined with a high level of integrity through practices that are ethical and overcome various problems and weaknesses related to corruption, abuse of power, deviation of law, etc. On the other hand, Indonesia in its bureaucratic practitioner recruitment system is in collusion, corruption, and nepotism, not based on the system or the quality and quality of the candidates' competencies.

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Qualimetry Methods in Assessing the Effectiveness of Management Decisions in Universities

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Abstract

Management decision in the university is a process of convergent analysis, forecasting and timely resolution of problem situations, aimed at achieving synergetic results. The research studies advantages and feasibility of using qualimetric methods for evaluating effectiveness of university's management decisions. Participants in management decision-making are the university founders or the state, the rector and vice-rectors, the Scientific Council, trade unions, dean's offices, departments, students and external stakeholders. Evaluation of management decisions' quality involves determining their effectiveness. Our proposal is to use the method, based on qualimetric analysis, in assessing effectiveness of management decisions in the university. The management decision effectiveness is based on the level of collaboration in decision-making, compliance of the decisions to the university development strategy, timely implementation of the decisions, and the decision efficiency. The degree of collaboration in decision-making is determined by the involvement of various stakeholders in the process. Estimation of the extent to which the decision complies with the university's development strategy is based upon the fact that the decision adopted may be directed to the achievement of certain objectives of the strategy, or run counter to it. Index of timeliness of a management decision implementation is the ratio of standard time to the actual time spent. The decision is effective if the index value is equal to 1 or exceeds it. Decision efficiency is evaluated based on the quality of its implementation. The integrated indicator of the decision-making effectiveness is a combination of values for all four parameters. Using the method of qualimetric analysis raises the level of personnel involvement in the process of managerial decision-making, objectivity and decisions' quality.

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The Effectiveness of Picture Story Books Implemented for Improving the Students' Reading Performance at the First Year of Pkbn Medaso Kolaka

Abstract

The reality of teaching English Reading at PKBM Medaso Kolaka revealed that most of students have problems and tend to find many difficulties in reading, for example the students' low performance and motivation in reading. This research aims to: 1) observe the effects of picture story books on students' reading performance. 2) clarify students' perception on the implementation of picture story books in reading class. The research was conducted at first year of Paket B PKBM Medaso Kolaka by using the experimental design. There were 15 students as samples selected by using purposive sampling. They were divided into two groups: experimental and control groups. The data were collected by using the pre-test, the treatment, the post-test, questionnaires, and interviews. The reading test was administered to the students of experimental and control class. The data were analyzed and interpreted by using Pearson Product Moment assisted by SPSS 14.0. The results revealed that picture story books are able to improve students' reading performance and the implementation of picture story books improves students' interest in reading. There is a significant difference between students' reading score in the pre-test to post-test, with higher scores found in the post-test. The sig. (2 tailed) was 0.0013 which is lower than 0.05. The comparison of students' reading improvement in experimental and control groups revealed the value of 0.025, which means that the improvement is significant. In conclusion, the implementation of picture story books can improve students' reading performance and students' reading interest.

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Innovation of Computer-Based Learning Multimedia at English Study Program of Teacher Training and Education Faculty of Sembilanbelas November University of Kolaka

Abstract

Based on the preliminary research, the researcher was found that the students' ability in English especially in Kolaka regency was low. To overcome the problem, needed the using of multimedia learning that is more creative and innovative. So, the learning atmosphere should be more enjoyable and the students are not bored. The implementation of using computer-based learning multimedia as one strategy in English teaching was proposed to improve the students' ability in English. By this strategy, it was hoped to improve the teaching quality continually and finally to improve the students' competency in English. The specific objective of the research was to create the computer-based learning multimedia which are creative and innovative. To achieve the target, the researcher was using development method by Plompt (1997) which consists of five steps, they were; (1) preliminary investigation, (2) planning, (3) realization/construction, (4) test, evaluation, and revision, and (5) implementation. Next, to know the implementation result of computer-based learning multimedia, the research was conducted in Classroom Action Research (CAR) that was adapted from Kemmis and Taggart (1998). By CAR, the researcher hoped to know the implementation of effective multimedia computer-based learning in improving the students' English ability at English study program. Based on the results of the research, it can be concluded that in order to improve English ability of students, needs to be presented in the form of activities that are more creative and innovative. One was through the use of computer-based learning multimedia. This is done in order to provide a more attractive presentation of the material and relevant to the conditions and characteristics of the students.

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Corporate Social Responsibility (Csr) in Perspective of Public Administration (A Study of Governance)

Abstract

The Implementation of CSR in Indonesia, most of them are not running in accordance with the existing theory because the government and society in CSR activities are not fully authorized to engage in these activities, because the company directly manages the CSR fund. Thus, the theory of governance puts three pillars as a principal provider of public service life, those are, (1) the state, (2) the civil society and (3) the private sector. CSR has to involve all parts or elements which know about CSR, with a focus on (1) Implementation of CSR has to be published and transparent. (2) CSR Fund is administered by a forum / team through a memorandum of understanding facilitated by the government in accordance with its role as mandating, facilitating, partnering, and endorsing. (3) CSR forum / team consists of; government, corporate (private), and society. (4) The form of regional regulation on CSR with reference to Constitution Number 40 of 2007 on the Limited Liability Companies and Government Regulation Number 47 of 2012 on Corporate Social Responsibility so that CSR is considered as one of the important instruments in public administration.

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Biological Aspects of blue Swimmer Crab (*Portunus pelagicus*) in Pomalaa Waters

Abstract

Commodity crab fishery resource (*Portunus pelagicus*) which is locally called “buk kang suji” has been exploited to increase revenues and compliance with the animal protein of Pomalaa’s people widely. For the sake of preserving and to achieve sustainable management, accurate information about the growth of local fisherman haul production and its crab size is needed. Direct observation of the crab haul was conducted with the aim of describing the crab condition and crab resource availability in the study area to be reviewed from biology aspect. The studies showed that during the observation all the haul crab size structure has a modus on lengthy class 54–56 mm, board 107–110 mm, thick 29.5–30.5, and weight 80–89 gram. Relationships of crab length, width, thickness and weight indicated a positive correlation toward whole parameters. It means that the increasing of one parameter is closely related to increasing the size of the other parameters. The growth pattern of caught crab (*Portunus pelagicus*) at Pomalaa sea is positively allometric with the b grade on 3.079 scale. The comparison of sex ratio between male and female crabs is 1:1.42, it means that crab sex ratio is in an unbalanced state.

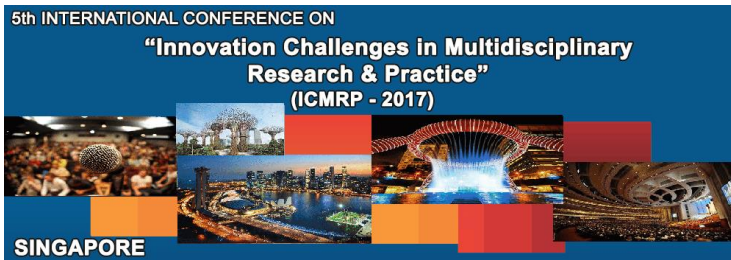

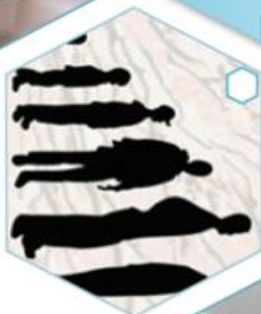

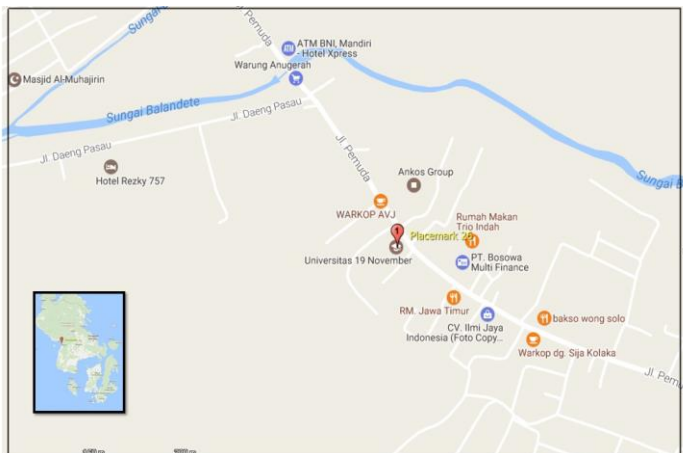
